WHY BUILD LATINO POWER

Latinxs make up 40% of Texas' population, and by 2022 we will be the majority in this state. It is our work, culture, food, art, and language that has shaped Texas into the state it is today. Jolt is building the collective voice, power, and influence of Latinxs across Texas so that our communities and families are treated with the respect that we deserve.



WHAT WE FIGHT FOR

Texas and our democracy are stronger when everyone has a seat at the table and when our voices and families are treated with equality and respect. For too long our community and our contributions have been ignored. The hard work and sacrifices of our families and parents make us who we are today, and we won't allow their contributions to be belittled. What is Jolt?

Jolt is a Texas-based organization that promotes issues and values important to the Latino community. We build the collective voice, power, and influence of our community so that our families are treated with equality and dignity.

WHAT DOES JOLT DO?

Jolt strives to create a sense of community and pride among Latinxs across Texas by telling the stories of Latinxs through art, encouraging Latinxs to become civically engaged, and registering them to vote.

WHAT WILL STUDENTS GAIN?

Chapter members will have the opportunity to attend Jolt's annual statewide trainings and engage with their peers from across Texas. Participating in Jolt will give students the skills to organize and make change in their communities.

Getting Started

The members of your Jolt chapter will register voters, organize around issues, get out the vote and, most importantly, have fun celebrating our community and culture.

4 EASY STEPS TO START YOUR JOLT CHAPTER

- 1. Find 5 Latino/POC friends and one advisor (faculty/staff)*
- 2. Vote on leadership positions.
- 3. Register your group online by visiting the Jolt Action Chapters Website.
- 4. A Jolt Representative will contact you to register your Chapter.
- * at least one eligible person to become a Deputy Registrar in Texas

WHY JOIN JOLT AND START A CHAPTER?

Want to meet really cool people in your community? Want to educate yourself on issues affecting the Latino community and find your voice? Want to hold elected officials accountable? Want to make a change? If you answered yes to any of these questions, Jolt is the place for you. Let Jolt help you create an awesome space in your community to amplify Latino voices.

WHY MUST I LIVE IN TEXAS?

Jolt is focusing on mobilizing the voice of the Latino community in Texas specifically because it is where we can make the biggest difference politically. Texas is 40% Latino, but that is not reflected in the state's elected officials. We are focusing on building the political power of the Latino community in Texas so it can more accurately represent its population.

GOT 5 LATINO/POC FRIENDS?*

You'll need at least five people, with the majority being Latino or people of color, to start a local Jolt chapter. This means that the majority of the members for your Jolt chapter identify as Latino/POC. (Latino Allies are always welcome as well!) For example, if you start with 5 people, at least 3 people must identify as Latino/POC.

ELECT OFFICERS

To start your chapter you will need to elect leaders: a president, vice president, secretary, Volunteer Deputy Registrar coordinator, and a communications coordinator. Leaders are elected to year-long terms. You can find full descriptions of each position on the next page.

IDENTIFY AN ADVISOR

This is a staff person at your school that can act as the sponsor for your chapter on campus.

SUBMIT A NEW CHAPTER APPLICATION

Once you have your five friends, your leaders elected, and an advisor it's time to register your group. Register your Jolt Chapter online by visiting the Jolt's Website (jolttx.org/jolt-chapters) and an organizer from the Jolt team will get back to you within a week.

Officer Roles

The officers of Jolt chapters set the tone for their chapter and are true grassroots leaders on their campuses and in their communities. Chapters need the following roles to be successful:

PRESIDENT

The president is the fearless leader of the chapter. They are responsible for moving the chapter forward on its goals and managing the rest of the chapter leadership team. The president is the primary contact between the chapter and Jolt's Regional Organizer and is responsible for keeping regular communication with them. Chapter Presidents are eligible to receive a monthly stipend for their leadership role.

VICE PRESIDENT

The vice president is secondary only in title and is just as vital to the chapter. The vice president is head of recruitment and works with the other chapter members to use their networks to identify new members. They are the primary event planner and stand in for the president when they are absent. Finally, the vice president is in charge of external communications with other organizations to cooperate for events.

TREASURER

In most cases, the responsibilities of the treasurer would also fall on the secretary. However, if your campus requires this position to be mandatory, it is okay to have this position independent from the secretary role. The treasurer is responsible for keeping an itemized list of all expenses and income for the chapter.

VDR COORDINATOR

The VDR coordinator as described in their title is in charge of all things voter registration. They make sure that members are becoming deputized and scheduling them for voter registration opportunities. They enlist members to do outreach to their professors so they can do voter registration and are the primary coordinators for their chapter's National Voter Registration Day activities.

COMMUNICATIONS COORDINATOR

Jolt's nationally recognized communications department works directly with the selected communication coordinator for each respected campus to uplift their efforts and highlight their contributions to our cause.

MEMBER ROLES

As a member of a Jolt student chapter you play a critical role at Jolt. You have the power to change Texas. There are three key roles chapter members participate in:

- 1. Create a culture of civic engagement on campus through identifying opportunities to register voters in classrooms, at campus events, and while tabling.
- 2. Build power for our community through voter registration and collecting pledge to vote cards so voters never miss an election.
- Demonstrate our power to turnout and turn-up the heat on legislators that don't treat our community with the respect we deserve by inputting pledge card data so that people can receive election reminders.

Start a Jolt Chapter

AS A JOLT CHAPTER, YOU COMMIT TO:

- Organizing Latino students & other students of color.
- Registering and mobilizing voters in your community

 Statewide Power Up Summit (Spring) and a representative to quarterly statewide calls.
- Commit to upholding Jolt's values. See page 6
- Mentoring the leaders who will continue the chapter after you graduate or step down.

JOLT COMMITS TO SUPPORTING YOU AND YOUR CHAPTER BY:

- Providing training on outreach, public speaking, civic engagement, and data management.
- Giving chapter members access to digital resources and funding for the chapter.
- Highlighting your chapter through Jolt's social media channels and earned media stories about your efforts.
- Celebrate the chapter's efforts and hard work at social events hosted by Jolt.
- Chapters will be issued social media guidelines and specific instructions for interacting with media.
